THE LORD NEVER STOPS CALLING HIS SHEPHERDS

A few weeks ago, I was in a remote hut in the mountains, between Copper and Vail Pass, together with Father John Nepil, the vice-rector of the Denver seminary, and 18 seminarians from various dioceses: Denver, Montana, Kansas, and Arizona. Every year, Father Nepil arranges an expedition like this. Five days in an utterly self-managed hut that can only be reached within three hours of snowshoeing or ski mountaineering. There is no running water, but only snow to melt on the single stove that heats the common room. The food is brought on the shoulders, and there is no phone signal!

As soon as we arrived, Deacon Jacob Machado divided us into four shifts: melting the snow, keeping the fire on, cooking, and washing the dishes.

During the following days, we prayed, climbed the surrounding mountains, read, played cards and board games. It seemed that the most popular game at the Denver Seminary was a card game called Jucker.

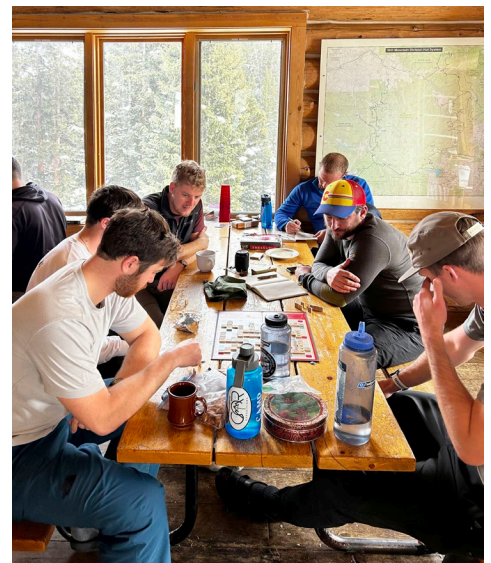
The seminarians were very intrigued by my presence. What was the reason for an Italian parish priest from a religious congregation to be on their retreat? Father John is an experienced mountaineer, so we climbed some



summits together, and I knew I would love it! But the reason for the invitation was a different one. Father John belongs to the companions of Christ, a group of diocesan priests who live a common life and are inspired by the teachings of the founder of my priestly community, Monsignor Massimo Camisasca, and Father Luigi Giussani. So he asked me to spend time with him and the seminarians so that they too could learn about the experience of us priests of the Fraternity of Saint Charles.

During those days, I had beautiful dialogues with the seminarians. I learned that some arrived at the seminary after years of working or servicing in the army. Many had a conversion or a deepening of their faith by meeting the Focus program in their colleges and then dedicating a few years as missionaries at other colleges and universities.

They are familiar with Giussani's name thanks to some of their professors who read his works assiduously. However, they had yet to have the opportunity to see Giussani's teaching embodied in the life of a priestly fraternity. Father John wanted to show them, through our friendship, that it is possible to live a common life among priests—and not just possible but recommended as a great resource for our spiritual and pastoral life!

From my point of view, I had a firsthand experience of the seriousness of the preparation that the seminarians

receive in this diocese. Their formators are like fathers to them and they are serious men, committed to their vocation and full of joy.

It was a privilege to accompany them during the retreat. I encourage you to pray for priestly vocations to our diocese and to the fraternity of Saint Charles. The Lord never stops calling his shepherds, even from a remote hut in the mountains.

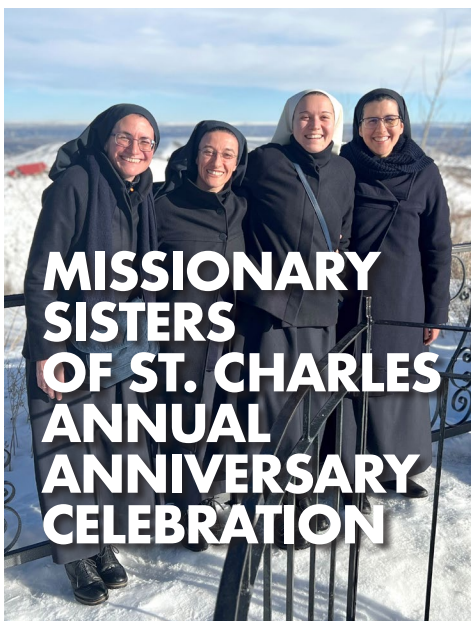

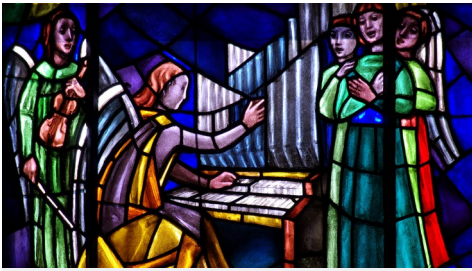


MISSIONARY SISTERS

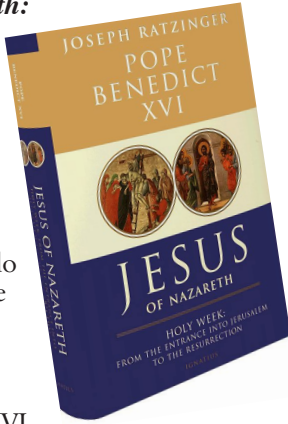

On March 19, we celebrate St. Joseph’s feast day. Around that time, the swallows return from Goya, Argentina to their spring and summer home in San Juan Capistrano, California. While the flocks that make this journey to the mission may not be in groups as large as in the past (a restoration project in the 1990s removed a lot of the mud nests from the walls of the mission), the journey for these small cliff birds is still around 6,000 miles. That sure seems like persistence.

Perseverance in daily duties and tasks can be seen as a characteristic of St. Joseph. Along with being steadfast, Fr. Peter Stamm, professor at St. John’s Seminary, notes that St. Joseph displays other helpful qualities that encourage us in our Lenten observance. These traits include relishing silence, having courage, and being obedient. You can check out Fr. Peter’s video on YouTube, “How St. Joseph Embodies the Spirit of Lent.”

No words of St. Joseph are actually recorded in the Gospels. Yet, we know that he was a righteous and reflective man who took courageous and bold actions. It was Joseph who loved Jesus and Mary and fled with them to the land of Egypt to protect the Christ child. Joseph was obedient to God’s plans, although he didn’t know the outcomes. In his work as a carpenter, Joseph lived a life of quiet heroism. He provided and cared for Jesus and Mary. St. Joseph is a powerful saint, friend, and role model to seek assistance in all things. After all, God the Father entrusted Mary and His Son to St. Joseph’s safekeeping.

Nativity is under the pastoral care of the **Priestly Fraternity of St. Charles Borromeo**, a religious order, founded in 1985 by Msgr. Massimo Camisasca in Italy. The order has its origins in the charism of Fr. Luigi Giussani, founder of the Catholic lay movement Communion and Liberation (CL). Here is how the Priestly Fraternity of St. Charles Borromeo is described by the founder, Msgr. Massimo Camisasca:

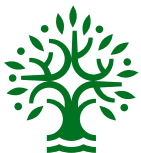
Fraternity: “The Fraternity is a companionship made up of people that are placed together by an Other. [...] Each of us [...] is continually accompanied by Christ through his brothers.”

Priestly: “The priestly vocation [...] is a continuous communion with God and man. [...] It acts as a bridge between heaven and earth, represents a fundamental link in the history of salvation, and also serves as an important figure in the journey towards unity among men.”

Missionary: “Mission [...] consists simply in entering within the same mission for which God sent His own Son into the world, for which the Son sent the Apostles, and for which, in turn, the Apostles sent other brothers, until the visible echo of that event touched even us.”

The priests of the Fraternity live together in houses of three or more. The communion among them is meant to sustain their vocation and be a path towards conversion. They are willing to be sent around the world wherever the Church has a need, according to the wishes of the bishop of the diocese in which they reside. Learn more at:

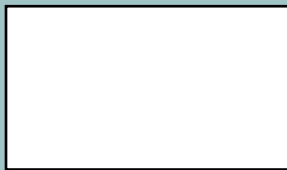
